

The Windsor-Essex County region is a cosmopolitan area of over 400,000 people. More than 1,200 acres straddle Essex County at the same latitude as Europe's finest wine regions, producing rich, ripe, full-bodied wines, reds and whites, ice wines and fruit wines. There are 15+ area wineries, family businesses and large corporate enterprises such as Colio Estate Wines and Pelee Island Winery, both ranking among Ontario's top five wineries by volume.

In recent months, Essex County winemakers again proved their skills. Ten area wineries took home 20 medals from Canada's prestigious and oldest wine competition. Based in Windsor, the 28th annual All Canadian Wine Championships attracted 152 wineries from across the country. Three dozen judges scored 1,045 entries.

Birding – Thousands of visitors travel to the Windsor Essex Pelee Island region annually to see the wide variety of birds that flock to our area. Our region hosts two major bird festivals annually that draw visitors from all over Ontario, Quebec and the U.S.

- Festival of Birds in May at Point Pelee National Park
- Festival of Hawks in September at Holiday Beach Conservation Area

Hunting – This region is known first and foremost as a waterfowl destination that includes the legendary Jack Miner's Bird Sanctuary. It's a known fact, to the local hunting population anyway, that our waterfowl, turkey and deer hunting take a back seat to no other region in the province.

Belle River has long been known as the "Muskie Capital of the World."

Black History – The Underground Railroad is neither a railroad nor is it underground. It is the name of the network of people who hid and guided slaves and refugees as they followed the North Star to Canada – to freedom.

Prohibition – Windsor was a major rum-running port in the early part of the twentieth century. In 1916, the State of Michigan adopted Prohibition, and in 1919 Prohibition was adopted nationally across the U.S. From then on, the City of Windsor became a major site for alcohol smuggling and gangster activity.

War of 1812 – The Windsor Essex region is steeped in history. As the site of the outbreak of the War of 1812, the only war ever fought on Canadian soil, it is an area rich in cultural, natural, and social history. Explore the trenches and barracks of the war of 1812 at sites like Fort Malden National Park.

Heritage Sites – The Windsor Essex region has truly fascinating historical and cultural landmarks. Visitors can discover Prohibition history from one of our founding business families at the Canadian Club Brand Heritage Centre, visit Mackenzie Hall in Olde Sandwich Towne or learn about the Underground Railroad at Amherstburg's Black History Museum. Explore the trenches and barracks of the War of 1812 at Fort Malden or examine Windsor's rich history as the birthplace of the automotive industry in Canada. Stately Willistead Manor was built by Edward Chandler Walker, son of Hiram Walker in 1917.

Our geographical location in Southwestern Ontario and bordering Detroit, Michigan provide us with several options for the 2013 TGAO Symposium.



A Blast From The Past

Prohibition, bus tour to include a 20-minute presentation at Mackenzie Hall by Marty Gervais. Alexander Mackenzie -Canada's 2nd Prime Minister, built Mackenzie Hall in 1855, this beautiful courthouse proudly honors its historical past, This would then be followed by a guided bus tour of LaSalle & Sandwich highlighting locations of export companies and Roadhouses along the riverfront.
