Samantha Magalas, Sports Tourism Officer is present and provides the following information relating to the IRC hosting an amateur Canada-Russia Hockey Match at the WFCU Centre on December 9, 2017:

He suggests Dr. Maev be invited to attend the next meeting of the International Relations Committee.

Dr. Jain suggests research be undertaken to determine if there is a Russian community in the City of Windsor.

J. Barycki refers to the Canada and European Union Agreement and he states there should be a student exchange with Windsor and cities in Europe. The European Region Action Scheme for the Mobility of University Students (ERASMUS) is a higher education exchange which guarantees that the period spent abroad is recognized by their university when they return.

B. Roberts suggests contacting the Windsor Essex Development Commission and he questions the funding source for this initiative.

Councillor Kusmierczyk requests examples from other municipalities be provided that will demonstrate how this works. J. Barycki states he will contact the Embassy and will report back.

Report of Official Delegation to Fujisawa, Japan and Gunsan, South Korea

From February 8th through February 13th, 2018 and official Delegation from the City of Windsor, led by Mayor Drew Dilkens and including International Committee Members, Councillor Fred Francis (Chairperson), Jerry Barycki, Sushil Jain, and L.T. Zhao, travelled to Fujisawa, Japan and Gunsan, South Korea to commemorate the 30th and 12th Anniversaries of our twinning, respectively, and to continue to build upon these relationships.

Fujisawa, Japan February 8-11, 2018

Twin Cities since December 1987, Windsor and Fujisawa have enjoyed various exchanges and programs including reciprocated visits of official delegations, event collaborations, special gift exchanges and memorable anniversary celebrations. 2017 marked the 30th Anniversary of the twinning relationship between our two cities and included a visit from an official delegation led by Mayor Tsuneo Suzuki and included the planting of three Cherry Blossom trees at Jackson Park, a gift from Fujisawa. The City of Windsor was then invited by Fujisawa to celebrate this very special anniversary in their City.

The delegation met with Mayor Tsuneo Suzuki, and Mr. Takayuki Masuda, Chair of the International Sister City Committee of Fujisawa, members of Fujisawa City Council and other Officials at City Hall. During their visit they had the opportunity to visit their New City Hall.



The visit also included a visit and tour of Isuzu Plaza, a large automobile gallery run by Isuzu Motors Limited. Here the delegation enjoyed a guided tour and learned of the company's manufacturing history. The delegation then participated in a tree planting ceremony was held at Fujisawa City Hall with the mayor of Nagasaki to commemorate the 30th anniversary conference of "National Council of Japan Nuclear Free Local Authorities". The Chinese parasol tree grew from the seed of the tree which was exposed to atomic bomb in Hiroshima. The 30th anniversary conference was held in Fujisawa and the special tree was dedicated by the "National Council of Japan Nuclear Free Local Authorities". Mayor Dilkens participated in the tree planting along with Mayor Moon and Mayor Taue of Nagasaki. Finally, the group experienced a traditional Japanese tea ceremony at Yugyo-ji Temple.



One of the highlights of the trip was a visit to the Misono Girl's School in Fujisawa. Since 2009 the City of Windsor has welcomed students from the Misono Girl's School who come to Windsor on a two week exchange that offers them the opportunity to experience and immerse in our culture. Their stay in Windsor always includes a tour of City Hall. This year the delegation had the opportunity to visit the school and meet with Ms. Yuka Shimozato, a teacher t the school that travels with the students annually. The delegation was treated to a tour of the new English Learning Centre as well as presentations from the students, some of which visited Windsor in July of 2017.



The very short visit trip ended with a 30th Twinning Anniversary Dinner hosted by the City of Fujisawa whose guest list included City Officials, Members of City Council, Members of the International Sister City Committee of Fujisawa, Members of the Japan Canada Society of Shonan, Members of Fujisawa Chamber of Commerce and more.

The City of Windsor and the City of Fujisawa look forward to their continued twin city relationship and future cooperation.

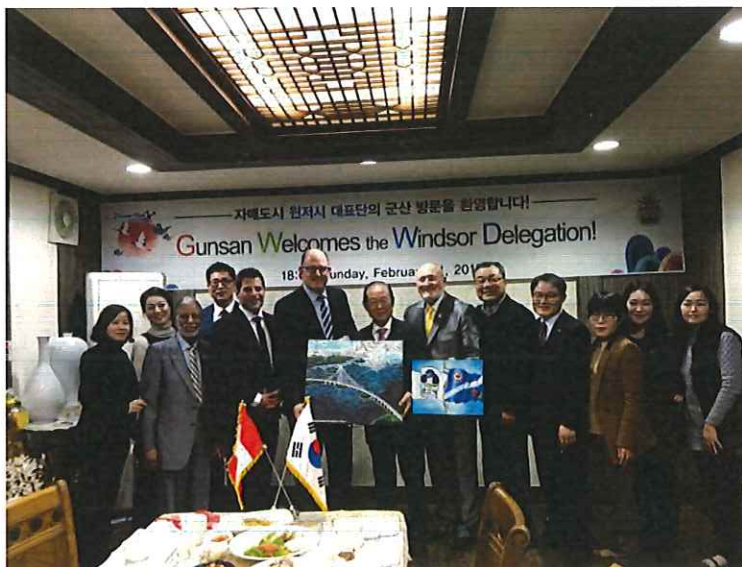
Gunsan, South Korea
February 11-13 2018

The City of Gunsan and the City of Windsor signed their twinning agreement in June 2005 and for the past twelve (12) years Windsor and Gunsan have been continuously supporting exchange activities. This includes hosting delegates from Gunsan on various occasions, and has participating in other exchanges including a work program exchange with Gunsan.



From February 11th through the 13th the delegation led by Mayor Dilkens was welcomed to Gunsan by Mayor MOON Dong-Shin and other Officials from the City of Gunsan.

During their brief visit the group met with Mayor Moon and other Officials and took part in an official gift exchange. The gift from Windsor, an original painting of the City of Windsor Flag and the city of Gunsan Flag is seen proudly displayed at City Hall along with past gifts presented by the City of Windsor.



The delegation participated in a meeting with Ms. Joungh-i Park, Chairperson of City Council who suggested that the Cities should consider more Council to Council relationships in order to expand the sharing of ideas.



The group had the opportunity to experience the Time Travel Village in the Modern Cultural Heritage Project District to learn more about the history and culture of the Gunsan. One of the highlights of the trip was the visit to the Saemangeum 33 Centre.

The Saemangeum Seawall, which is the world's largest is 33 kilometers long and is part of a long term national reclamation project. Once the area where the river meets the sea has been completely filled, it will have added an area of roughly 400 square kms to the Korean peninsula. Because of its strategic location the aim is to develop the new land into a global economic cooperation hub.



A park in the reclaimed area is known as the "Saemangeum Land for Children" includes various facilities and public artworks, including a wall of art tiles which includes the images of the drawings from Windsor Children that were included in the Children's Art Exchange exhibition. The wall will serve to celebrate the friendship that Gunsan and their sister cities have shared.

In addition to the meetings with Mayor Moon and other officials from City Hall, the delegation had the opportunity to meet with While in Gunsan the delegation had the opportunity to meet with Advisory Ambassador Peter Hoesang Jeung, Director General In-Saeng Kim of Local Autonomy Administration Bureau, Director Joong-gyu Kim of Museum Management Director Seo Kwangsoun of Saemangeum International Cooperation, and Mr. Gi-chul Lee, Chief of Transportation Facility Section.

Conclusion

The very short five day trip was especially successful and served to build upon the strong ties which have developed between the City of Windsor and the Cities of Fujisawa and Gunsan. The delegation was very well received in both cities and was able to experience firsthand some of what our twin cities of Fujisawa and Gunsan have to offer along with progress that has been made.

During this visit many discussions took place in relation to government procedures as well as economic and tourism opportunities. Further cultural and sport exchanges in addition to youth and educational exchanges between our citizens were also very important topics of discussion as these continued reciprocal interactions will contribute to a better understanding between the people of our countries and will result in increased future cooperation.

-Planting Atomic Bomb Exposed Second Generation Chinese Parasol Tree-

On February 10th, the second generation tree of the Chinese Parasol Tree “Aogiri”; which was burnt by atomic bomb in Hiroshima during the War but revived, was planted within the property of main building of the Fujisawa City Hall. On the day, planting ceremony was held and members related to the city and children covered the tree with soils wishing for peace and abolishment of nuclear weapon.

The second generation Chinese Parasol Tree “Aogiri” was given to Fujisawa to commemorate the 30th anniversary conference of “National Council of Japan Nuclear Free Local Authorities” which was held in 2014. Mayor Tsuneo Suzuki of Fujisawa and Mayor Tomihisa Taue of Nagasaki; who is also the chairperson of “National Council of Japan Nuclear Free Local Authorities,” have attended the ceremony. Also Mayor Drew Dilkens of Windsor, Canada who was visiting for sister city anniversary attended the ceremony.

Mayor Suzuki made a speech wishing for everyone to look after the tree to thrive on and hoping that this would be an opportunity for enhancing world peace.
