#### Report on the Audit of the Campaign Income and Expenses

#### **Qualified Opinion**

At the request of the Fazle Baki - Candidate for School Board Trustee (the "Recipient"), we have audited the Recipient's Statement of Campaign Income and Expenses which comprise the Project's financial position as at the Expiration Date of the Agreement, December 31, 2022.

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion section of our report, the accompanying Campaign Income and Expenses are presented fairly, in all material respects.

#### **Basis for Qualified Opinion**

In common with many candidates, the Fazle Baki - Candidate for School Board Trustee pays for expenses from cash on hand, the completeness of which is not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, our verification of Honorarium Expenditures was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the Fazle Baki - Candidate for School Board Trustee's bank statements and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to expenses subject to the general spending limit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Campaign Income and Expenses section of our report. We are independent of Fazle Baki - Candidate for School Board Trustee in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the Campaign Income and Expenses in Canada, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified opinion.
