



Bitternut Hickory

Carya cordiformis

Hardiness Zone 4
 Mature Height 50-60 feet
 Mature Form Round to oblong
 Features The bark is first smooth and gray. Later broken into long plates attached at the middle, curving away from the trunk resulting in a coarsely shaggy appearance
 Insect or Diseases No common problems
 Culture Prefers deep, moist soils that range from poorly drained to well drained, but is often found in drier conditions. Tolerates shade in its youth, but needs full sun at maturity, and is adaptable to acidic, neutral, or alkaline pH soils.
 Notes Constantly raining debris from its fruit crop from late summer throughout autumn, making fall cleanup in urban areas more challenging.
