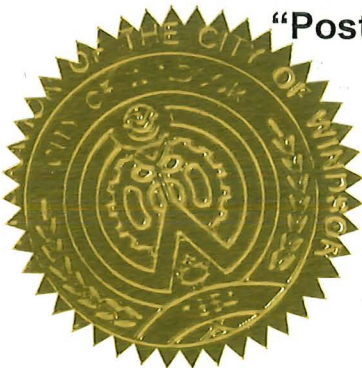
## PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS:** June 27<sup>th</sup> has been designated as Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) Awareness Day; and,
