1. Call to Order

The Chair calls the meeting to order at 9;30 o'clock a.m. and the Windsor Licensing Commission considers the Agenda being Schedule A attached hereto, matters which are dealt with as follows:

2. Disclosure of Interest

Councillor Renaldo Agostino discloses an interest and abstains from voting on Item 7(b) being 1287678 Ontario Inc. o/a Turbo Espresso Lounge as he is a close friend and former associate of the applicant.

3. Adoption of the Minutes

Moved by Councillor Angelo Marignani, seconded by Sam Sinjari,
That the minutes of the meeting of the Windsor Licensing Commission held
December 5, 2024 **BE ADOPTED** as presented.

4. Requests for Deferrals, Referrals or Withdrawals

Craig Robertson reports there is a request to withdraw Item 7(c), applicant Patrick Kim, 2779590 Ontario Inc. o/a Harbour House. He advises that confirmation was received from the Fire Department that the applicant complied with the necessary deficiencies and requirements prior to the meeting. The Fire Department has approved the 2024 application and confirmed that the applicant came in to renew for 2025.

7. Applications/Hearings

7(a) 14048601 Canada Inc. o/a Cup or Cone

Craig Robertson advises that the applicant Khalifah Salah, 14048601 Canada Inc. o/a Cup or Cone is not present. He adds that the applicant has not responded to phone calls from the Fire Department or has reached out to Administration regarding the hearing.

Moved by Councillor Renaldo Agostino, seconded by Sam Sinjari, That the Windsor Licensing Commission **REFUSE TO RENEW**, Hospitality Food Service licence, 24 034238 for 14048601 Canada Inc. o/a Cup or Cone, 4320 Howard Avenue, Windsor, ON N9G 1P4 285 submitted on July 26, 2024. Carried.

7(b) 1287678 Ontario Inc. o/a Turbo Espresso Lounge

Dr. Dante Capaldi is present regarding the Entertainment Lounge licence (# 24 028779) for 1287678 Ontario Inc. o/a Turbo Espresso Lounge, 285 Ouellette Avenue, Windsor, Ontario.

David McGregor, Fire Prevention Officer is also present

Craig Robertson provides the chronology of events as it relates to the licence transfer request as follows:

- June 20, 2024, renewal was submitted for the Entertainment Lounge licence for 1287678 Ontario Inc. o/a Turbo Espresso Lounge.
- December 17, 2024, Fire Prevention Officer, David McGregor, conducted an initial fire inspection and observed various violations under the Ontario Fire Code.
- February 5 and February 26, 2025, Fire Prevention Officer, David McGregor attempted to contact the applicant for re-inspection.
- March 6, 2025, Fire Prevention Officer David McGregor attended for follow-up inspection, and noted that many of the deficiencies remained outstanding.
- April 1, 2025, Fire Prevention Officer, David McGregor spoke to the applicant advising re-inspection needed to be completed.
- April 7, 2025 Licencing Office issues a refuse to renew letter stating the application has not satisfied the fire inspection requirement and to contact the Fire Prevention Office, David McGregor at Fire & Rescue Services to bring the fire inspection into compliance by no later than April 22, 2025.
- April 25, 2025, Applicant has not satisfied fire inspection requirement to date.

Craig Robertson advises Administration's position on the matter is that they have been operating since 2024 with fire deficiencies that have not been addressed or, verified that they have been corrected, and it is not in the public interest to continue with this application.

Dr. Dante Capaldi provides the following remarks:

- He advises that he is the owner of the building who allowed the operator to manage the building. He adds that he neglected the property
- There was no communication between this institution and his company.
- Requests that the licence be suspended for a period of time to allow him to complete the deficiencies according to the Order.
- He states that the Registered Letter sent to 285 Ouellette was never received.

Craig Robertson responds they are not revoking or suspending the licence as the licence has not been issued. He indicates that the applicant does not have a municipal business licence at this time. Direction is to refuse the 2024 application, to correct everything and then apply for the 2025 licence.

In response to a question asked by Dr. Dante Capaldi regarding if the operator can continue operating without a licence, Craig Robertson responds at this point they are operating without a licence, and they could be subject to fines or penalties. Craig Robertson states they typically do not hold up a business operation when an application has been submitted. He states the issue they have is that the Fire Department who have visited the property has noted deficiencies. He indicates there is no revocation or suspension of the licence; they are refusing to renew the 2024 licence application. By the Committee refusing to renew the licence, this will provide an opportunity to comply

with the Fire Code and to get the building up to standards. Following that, the licensee can apply for the 2025 license as a new application.

Discussion ensues regarding notice and as the Licencing Department has no record of the current applicant's address, it is generally agreed that the applicant is requested to provide that information at the time of the application. Craig Robertson confirms that the mailing address on file is that of the business as provided by the applicant.

Councillor Angelo Marignani asks that David McGregor, Fire Prevention Officer provide an overview of the Fire Code deficiencies. It is noted there are nine violations.

Sam Sinjari questions if a deferral would be easier as the operator is not present. Craig Robertson responds that the licence is not issued to the operator; the licence is issued to the corporation. He adds there are two options – can take Administration's recommendation or to provide the applicant with additional time to correct the deficiencies within a prescribed deadline. Once corrected, would apply for their 2025 renewal with penalty.

Moved by Councillor Angelo Marignani, seconded by Sam Sinjari,

That **APPROVAL BE GIVEN** to allow the application for an Entertainment Lounge Licence at 285 Ouellette Avenue o/a Turbo Espresso Lounge to continue for 30 days and if compliance with the fire requirements has not been met, that the application would automatically **BE REFUSED** and,

If there is compliance, the applicant would **BE REQUIRED** to apply for the 2025 licence which would be subject to licence fees and penalties, and further,

That communication **BE IMPROVED** to ensure that all germane information is provided to the Licensing Department.

Licence Commissioner's Comments:

The attached applications were received by the Licensing Division from Golnar Karimi c/o The Estate of the late Fazlullah Rezagian, Plate Holder of Taxicab Plate #088, and for the prospective transfer of Taxicab Plate #088.

Regulatory Authority:

Schedule 5, Part VII, Section 20.1 through 20.6 of Public Vehicle Licensing By-law 137-2007 as amended states:

- "20.1 Except as approved by the Licensing Commission, a taxicab plate holder may not transfer a taxicab plate and associated taxicab plate holder licence for a period of at least five (5) years from the date of issue of the licence.
- 20.2 No taxicab plate holder licence shall be transferred without the approval of the Licensing Commission.
- 20.3 No taxicab plate holder licence shall be transferred until the person to whom the transfer is to be made has first received approval from the Licence Commissioner as a licensee.
- 20.4 Subject to the restrictions herein, taxicab plates numbered 001 to 224 are transferable, provided that:
 - (a) the transferee satisfies the eligibility criteria for inclusion on the Drivers' List;
 - (b) the transferee signs a form of statutory declaration prescribed by the Licence Commissioner;
 - (c) the transferor has completed a written application for the transfer in the prescribed form;
 - (d) the transferee satisfies the requirements of a taxicab plate holder under this By-law, including submitting for inspection the taxicab to which the plate will be affixed;
 - (e) the transferee pays all fees required under this By-law;

and the transferee will receive a taxicab plate holder licence at the time of transfer of the taxicab plate."

Further, Section 21.3 states:

"A taxicab or taxicab wheelchair accessible vehicle plate holder who has held a licence for a minimum of one (1) year may lease the taxicab or taxicab wheelchair accessible vehicle licence on a daily, weekly, monthly or yearly basis provided that:

- (h) the lessee is licensed by the City of Windsor as a taxicab driver;
- (b) all weekly, monthly or yearly leases are filed with and approved by the Licence Commissioner and shall be subject to such terms and conditions the Licence Commissioner may require;
- (c) the amount charged under the lease shall be a fair fee as approved by the Licence Commissioner and no additional charges shall be made against the lessee;
- (d) the lease agreement shall include a statement that the leasing agreement is considered null and void in the event that the lessor or lessee, either by written or verbal agreement, sub-leases the taxicab or taxicab wheelchair accessible vehicle or transfers responsibility for the operation of the taxicab or taxicab wheelchair accessible vehicle to a third party;
- the lease agreement shall contain a clearly-stated right of the lessor and lessee to early termination of the lease;
- (f) where the lessee is a corporation, the lessee shall, at the time at which the lease is filed with the Licence Commissioner in accordance with the provision of this section, file with the Licence Commissioner a form supplied by the Licence Commissioner and a copy of the lessee's articles of incorporation, amendment or amalgamation; and,
- (g) the lease term shall be a minimum of twelve (12) months and a maximum of twenty-four (24) months."
- 20.5 Subject to the restrictions herein, taxicab plates numbered 001 to 224 inclusive may be transferred by an estate, provided that:
 - (a) within 30 days following the death of an individual holding one or more taxicab plates and associated taxicab plate holder licences, the estate trustee shall file with the Licence Commissioner:
 - (i) proof of death of the individual in the form of an original Funeral Director's Statement of Death; and
 - (ii) a copy of the Certificate of Appointment of Estate Trustee.
- 20.6 On the death of an individual holding one or more taxicab plates and associated taxicab plate holder licenses:

- (a) the estate trustee may continue to hold any taxicab plates and associated taxicab plate holder licenses for up to two (2) years following the date of death, subject to the requirements of this By-law;
- (a) during the two (2) year period following the date of death, the estate trustee may transfer the taxicab plate(s) and associated taxicab plate holder licence(s) to anyone meeting the eligibility requirements for inclusion on the Drivers' List, including the estate trustee in his or her personal capacity;
- (b) after the expiry of two (2) years following the date of death, all taxicab plates and associated taxicab plate holder licenses that have not been transferred in accordance with subsections (a) or (b) shall be revoked and must be immediately returned to the Licence Commissioner by the estate trustee.
- (c) Notwithstanding subsection (c), if the estate trustee has not transferred all taxicab plates and associated taxicab plate holder licenses in accordance with subsections (a) or (b), the estate trustee may request a hearing of the Licensing Commission to consider an extension of up to one (1) year before revocation.

Summary:

On August 28, 2024, Meeting of the Windsor Licensing Commission Decision WLC4/2024 approves Golnar Karimi, Estate Trustee, to hold City of Windsor Taxicab Plate #088 and any associated licenses until September 10, 2025.

On July 15, 2025, A registered letter is sent by the Deputy Licence Commissioner to Estate Trustee, Golnar Karimi in reminder to Windsor Licensing Commission decision WLC 4/2024 held on August 28, 2024.

On August 20, 2025, application received from Golnar Karimi, Estate Trustee, requesting Taxicab Plate Transfer, transferor application

On August 20, 2025. Application received from Rami Khazaleh Taxicab Plate Transfer, transferee application

It is being requested that Taxicab Plate #088 be transferred to Rami Khazaleh, who is currently not a licensed plate holder. Although Rami Khazaleh does not hold a current place on the Drivers' List, he has provided proof that he has been employed as a full-time taxicab driver since September 8, 2023, which satisfies the requirements of Section 20.4(a) of Schedule 5 to By-law 137-2007.

The prospective transferee must:

- (a) Submit a completed Plate Holder application and pay the associated fee;
- (b) Provide verification that full compensation has been made to Golnar Karimi c/o The estate of the late Fazlullah Rezagian in consideration of the transfer of taxicab plate #088.
- (c) Provide verification of an appropriate vehicle to which they will affix taxicab plate #088, including a valid safety standards certificate;

Recommendation:

To the Windsor Licensing Commission for decision on the following:

THAT the transfer of Taxicab Plate #088 from The Estate of the late Fazlullah Rezagian to Rami Khazaleh **BE APPROVED** with the following conditions:

- Rami Khazaleh given thirty (30) days from the date of the approval to submit a vehicle for inspection that complies with Schedule 5 to By-Law 137-2007 as amended, including a valid safety standards certificate.
- ii. Rami Khazaleh given thirty (30) days from the date of the approval to submit a Taxicab Plate Holder application and pay the associated fee.
- iii. Rami Khazaleh given thirty (30) days from the date of the approval to provide verification that full compensation has been made to Rubina Amjad in consideration of the transfer of Taxicab plate #88.
- iv. Rami Khazaleh shall not lease Taxicab plate #88 for a one-year period as stated in Schedule 5, Section 21.3 of Licensing By-Law 137-2007 as amended.

Licence Commissioner's Comments:

Golmar Karimi, Estate Trustee for the late Fazlullah Rezagian, submitted the attached letter (Appendix "C") requesting an extension to the time frame that she is permitted to hold Taxicab Plate #088 and its associated Taxicab Plate Holder licence as governed under the City of Windsor's Public Vehicle Licensing By-law 150-2018.

Regulatory Authority:

- Schedule 5, Part VII, Section 20.5 and 20.6 of Public Vehicle Licensing By-law No. 150-2018 states:
- 20.5 Subject to the restrictions herein, taxicab plates numbered 001 to 224 inclusive may be transferred by an estate, provided that:
 - (a) within 30 days following the death of an individual holding one or more taxicab plates and associated taxicab plate holder licences, the estate trustee shall file with the Licence Commissioner:
 - (i) proof of death of the individual in the form of an original Funeral Director's Statement of Death; and
 - (ii) a copy of the Certificate of Appointment of Estate Trustee.
- 20.6 On the death of an individual holding one or more taxicab plates and associated taxicab plate holder licenses:
 - (a) the estate trustee may continue to hold any taxicab plates and associated taxicab plate holder licenses for up to two (2) years following the date of death, subject to the requirements of this By-law;
 - (b) during the two (2) year period following the date of death, the estate trustee may transfer the taxicab plate(s) and associated taxicab plate holder licence(s) to anyone meeting the eligibility requirements for inclusion on the Drivers' List, including the estate trustee in his or her personal capacity;
 - (c) after the expiry of two (2) years following the date of death, all taxicab plates and associated taxicab plate holder licenses that have not been transferred in accordance with subsections (a) or (b) shall be revoked and must be immediately returned to the Licence Commissioner by the estate trustee.
 - (d) Notwithstanding subsection (c), if the estate trustee has not transferred all taxicab plates and associated taxicab plate holder licenses in accordance with subsections (a) or (b), the estate trustee may request a hearing of the Licensing Commission to consider an extension of up to one (1) year before revocation.

Background:

- September 13, 2022, the Licensing Division is notified from Vets Cab
 Administration of the death of Fazlullah Rezagian, plate holder of Taxicab Plate #088.
- January 10, 2023, a registered letter is sent by the Deputy Licence Commissioner to trustee, Golnar Karimi requesting direction from the estate pertaining to Taxicab Plate #088 in accordance to the regulations under the City of Windsor's Public Vehicle Licensing By-law 150-2018.

- March 2, 2023, The Licensing Division is in receipt of a proof of death certificate for Fazlullah Rezagian. This document is not included as an appendix to this report as it is deemed personal information under the *Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (MFIPPA)*. The Deputy Licence Commissioner reviewed the document and was satisfied with content.
- March 2, 2023, the Licensing Division is in receipt of a Last Will and Testament
 of Fazlullah Rezagian naming Golnar Karimi trustee, being Appendix "A".
- May 27, 2024, the Licensing Division is in receipt of a letter from trustee, Golnar Karimi requesting an extension to transfer City of Windsor Taxicab Plate #088, being Appendix "C".

Summary:

According to the City's licensing database (AMANDA), Fazlullah Rezagian had been the plate holder of Taxicab #088 annually since 2018; Mr. Rezagian died on September 10, 2022.

On February 22, 2023, the Licensing Division was notified of Golnar Karimi's intentions to transfer Taxicab Plate #088. Upon obtaining the Last Will and Testament of Fazlullah Rezagian,, naming Golnar Karimi as Estate Trustee, in accordance to the City's regulations Golnar Karimi is permitted to hold Taxicab Plate #088 and the associated plate holder licence for no more than two (2) years from the date of Fazlullah Rezagian's passing.

As noted under *Regulatory Authority*, the Estate Trustee may request a hearing of the Windsor Licensing Commission to consider an extension of up to one (1) year if the Estate Trustee has not transferred all taxicab plates and associated taxicab plate holder licenses within the two (2) year timeframe permitted under By-law 150-2018.

On May 27, 2024, the Licensing Division was in receipt of a letter from Golnar Karimi requesting an extension to transfer City of Windsor Taxicab Plate #088 as she had encountered financial difficulty since the passing of Fazlullah Rezagian. Golnar Karimi is requesting that the Windsor Licensing Commission approve an extension of an additional 12 months to transfer Taxicab Plate #088 as outlined under by-law 150-2018.

Given the circumstances mentioned above Administration does not find Golnar Karimi's request for an extension to be unreasonable.

It should be noted that in accordance with the City's Public Vehicle Licensing By-law 150-2018 that failure for Golnar Karimi to transfer Taxicab Plate #088 by any extended deadlines will result with the plate being automatically revoked and returned to the Licence Commissioner to offer to the next eligible taxicab driver on the *Driver's List*.

Recommendation:

To the Windsor Licensing Commission for decision on the following:

i. THAT the Windsor Licensing Commission RECOMMEND to City Council THAT the request to permit Golnar Karimi, Estate Trustee, to hold City of Windsor Taxicab Plate #088 and any associated licenses BE APPROVED until September 10, 2025, and further THAT Taxicab Plate #088 BE REVOKED and RETURNED to the Licence Commissioner should the taxicab plate not be transferred on or before September 10, 2025.

THIS IS THE LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT of me, FAZLULLAH REZAGIAN, of the City of Windsor, in the County of Essex and the Province of Ontario.

- 1. I HEREBY REVOKE all wills and codicils that I have made before the time of signing this Will, and declare this only to be my last Will.
- 2. I NOMINATE, CONSTITUTE AND APPOINT my wife, GOLNAR KARIMI, to be the Estate Trustee of this my Will, provided that should my said wife predecease me or should she die before the administration of my estate has been completed, or should she be unwilling or unable to act, I NOMINATE, CONSTITUTE AND APPOINT my daughter, KIEMIA REZAGIAN, and my daughter, AVA REZAGIAN, jointly and severally, to be the Estate Trustees of this my Will, in the place and stead of my said wife, GOLNAR KARIMI. The expression my "Trustee" hereinafter used shall mean the Estate Trustee(s) for the time being of this my Will.
- 3. I GIVE, DEVISE AND BEQUEATH all my property of every nature and kind and wheresoever situate, including any property over which I may have a general power of appointment, to my said Trustee upon the following trusts, namely:
 - (a) To deliver all articles of personal, domestic and household use or ornament, belonging to me at my death, including consumable stores and any automobiles and accessories thereto owned by me, to my wife, GOLNAR KARIMI, if she shall have survived me;
