## BIKEWAY SIGNAGE (not shown on map)

- BICYCLE ROUTE Marker Sign  
Indicates that the roadway is an official bicycle route. Motorists are to watch for cyclists and be prepared to share the road with them.
- RESERVED BIKE Lane Sign  
Indicates that the lane is reserved for exclusive use of bicycles. This is designated by a lane marking separating the portion of road used by motor vehicles from the portion of road used by bicycles.
- SHARROW Road Marking  
Sharrows are road markings that help cyclists position themselves on the road while reminding both motorists and cyclists to share the space.
- MAXIMUM SPEED Sign  
Indicates that the maximum speed limit on all trails is 20km/h.
